41 new works by 60 different authors added to PM World Library

PM World Collection grows to more than 1400 project management articles, papers & other works by 684 different authors in more than 60 countries

10 September 2015 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 41 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management (P/PM) have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 60 different authors in 18 countries were published in the September 2015 edition of the PM World Journal (PMWJ). They can now be found among the most recent papers, articles and book reviews on the PMWL home page at www.pmworldlibrary.net.

The new additions bring the total in the PM World Collection to over 1420 original works by 684 different authors from 60+ countries. The collection is growing each month by 30-40 new works by many different authors; of the 60 authors this month, 39 were new to the journal and library. According to PMWL Director David Pells, “This month we have included papers originally presented at three recent project management conferences, the April conference at the University of Latvia in Riga, the June event at the University of Maryland, and the August symposium at the University of Texas at Dallas. Republishing these papers in our Second Editions section dramatically increases the number of new authors in the journal and library, which is great.”
