### 36 new works added to PM World Library

#### **PM World Collection grows to 5,382 project management articles, papers & other works by 2,090 authors in 90+ countries**

15 March 2025 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 36 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 42 authors in 20 different countries were published in the February 2025 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://pmworldjournal.com/>. The new additions bring the total in the [PM World Collection](#) to 5,382 original works by 2,090 different authors located around the world. The collection is growing each month by 30-40 new works from many different authors; of the 42 authors this month 11 were new to the journal and library. According to PMWJ Managing Editor David Pells, “It is now becoming clear that the PMWJ might be a major bridge between academia and practice now. The ten featured papers this month, which are all research based and fully referenced, include a mix of academic and professional efforts. We insist that featured papers be conference quality, in both content and authorship, and we’ve been very pleased with the submittals in recent months. The addition of articles, reports and other works by knowledgeable practitioners complete the story.”

New authors this month include: Maria Elizabeth Arteaga-Garcia (Ecuador), Nazy Fouladirad (USA), Roberto Di Gioacchino (Italy), Dr. Leon Herszon (USA), Guy N. Igbokwe (Nigeria), Prof Cecilia Alexandra Poralanza-Chavarria (Ecuador), Dinesh Sharma (India), Moses Evance Silumbwe (Zambia), Himani Verma (India) and Samuel Zachariah (Botswana). New works by 31 authors already included in the library were also added.

“The wide variety of authors, locations and topics fully supports our knowledge sharing mission,” Pells adds. “Most issues in project management are not unique to location, industry, size or type. As evidenced in the February PMWJ, we can all still learn a great deal from others, regardless of country or culture. Continuous learning can really be enhanced by a very broad spectrum.”
