Managing PPPs during their contract life

Guidance for sound management of Public Private Partnerships added to PMWL

7 May 2016 – Milan, Italy – A new resource has been added to the PM World Library related to Public Sector Programs and Projects. The new resource is titled “*Managing PPPs during their contract life*”.

In March 2014, the European PPP Expertise Centre (EPEC) published the report “*Managing PPPs during their contract life*”, which can be defined as the most updated and exhaustive resource on general practices regarding projects between private and public actors in the form of PPPs (Public Private Partnerships).

Its structure recalls the one of the same PPP projects, deepening every phases but focusing mainly on the design and the performance of the operational management role. The design begins with the organization of the operational management team and its governance, goes through the tools involved – PPP’s contracts, information and data – and ends with the financial model developed for the operational management of PPPs. The second section regards all the activities that need to be undertaken in order to guarantee the success of each project. It deals with different topics, such as the prevention of disputes, the necessity of periodic reviews and the management of changes and the project’s final steps.
