Annual Congress of project management Project management and new technologies PMI Madrid Chapter - Madrid, November 15, 2018

Margarita Luz García Molino, with her presentation "New technologies in the world of health", presented us a real success story in which new technologies are helping and improving the world's health and the way in which it will revolutionize in a not-too-distant future.

Ana Isabel Gálvez Pérez, was selected to participate in the Summit ALF of Circular economy and technological innovation in Madrid, which was attended by more than five well known people, including Barack Obama and summarized us the key messages discussed in the Summit. It should turn towards a circular economy and abandoning the linear, that is where we are at the moment.

Vanessa Osoro Urigüen, recently arrived from the United States, introduced us to "The use of Big Data to improve strategic decision-making process" whose purpose is to provide better services to end-customers in the financial sector. Therefore, he shared his experience on the importance of the use of new technologies for the transformation of the organizations.

As it comes tradition, Congress is given recognition to the effort and participation of volunteers in the chapter, giving the award to the volunteer of the year.
