Student registrations from 376 universities in 80 countries

23 August 2019 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that student registrations in the PM World Library (PMWL) have surpassed 550 and include students from 376 different universities in 80 different countries. Students attending accredited universities anywhere in the world can receive two years of free PMWL membership.

According to PMWL Director David Pells, “I think a majority of students registering in the PMWL are graduate students and most likely studying project management. In any case, they are clearly interested in learning more about program and project management. Student registrations are, in fact, the highest category of library members; this seems to support our goal to create a global resource for continuous learning.”

- UK – 36 universities
- India – 27 universities
- Australia – 17 universities
- South Africa – 14 universities
- Pakistan – 14 universities
- Canada – 12 universities
- Ireland – 9 universities
- Nigeria – 9 universities
- Germany – 9 universities

“The countries where universities are located track to our website traffic,” Pells adds. “These are primarily English-speaking countries, with the exception of Germany, where a majority of our readers and members are located, which makes sense. But it’s encouraging to see so many students signing up from so many other countries. For example, we also have quite a few student members in Brazil, Colombia, France, Indonesia, Italy, Mexico, Zimbabwe and other countries.”
