30 new works by 31 authors added to PMWL in December

PM World Collection grows to 3,328 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,492 different authors in more than 65 countries

14 December 2019 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 30 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 31 different authors representing 14 countries were published in the December 2019 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://pmworldjournal.com/>. The new additions bring the total in the PM World Collection to 3,361 original works by 1,502 different authors in 65+ countries. The collection is growing each month by 30+ new works from many different authors; of the 31 authors this month, 10 were new to the journal and library. According to PMWL Director David Pells, “We ran out of student papers in November, so this month’s edition has fewer authors. We expect to start published research papers by graduate students at SKEMA in France soon. New authors this month included Edwin Burt (USA), Farai Dzapasi (Zimbabwe), Dauglas Halimani (Zimbabwe), Christian Osita Ifediora (Nigeria), Sharon Harris (USA), Tariro Mavaza (Zimbabwe), Eduardo Miranda (USA), Oghemena Okobiah (Nigeria/USA), Gina Pickett (USA) and Kumar Sarma (India). New works from 21 authors already included in the library were also added.

“This month’s edition contains some excellent articles and papers,” Pells adds. “Be sure to read Alan Stretton’s concluding article in his series on project contexts. In fact, all five of the series articles are outstanding. Note the research papers by academic authors in Nigeria and Zimbabwe this month. The PMWJ is becoming a popular vehicle for academic researchers in some countries to see their research results published quickly to a global audience. This is a welcome development”
