40 new works by 48 authors added to PMWL in June

PM World Collection grows to 3,552 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,563 different authors in more than 70 countries

14 June 2020 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 40 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 48 different authors representing 18 countries were published in the June 2020 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://pmworldjournal.com/>. The new additions bring the total in the PM World Collection to 3,552 original works by 1,563 different authors in 70+ countries. The collection is growing each month by 30+ new works from many different authors; of the 48 authors this month, 12 were new to the journal and library. According to PMWL Director David Pells, “The range of works published in the PMWJ this month was impressive, ranging from important traditional topics to issues in more focus during the pandemic, including virtual learning, leadership, ethics and stakeholders. Thirteen featured papers is close to a monthly record; the seven series articles, five advisories and three commentaries provide depth and diversity this month.”

New authors this month include Mohamed Ahmed (Somaliland), Omar Bashir (India), Edgar Bradley (South Africa), Hadi Colakoglu (Turkey), Mohamad-Fadl Harake (France/Lebanon), Maryam Audeh Ibrahim (Lebanon), Steve Kempster (UK), Thomas Maak (Australia), Nazieh Moussa (Lebanon), Key Parry (Australia), Vacheslav Pozniakov (Russia) and Lola Saliba (Lebanon). New works from 36 authors already included in the library were also added.

“I hope everyone reads the tribute to Russ Archibald,” Pells adds. “Russ was a project management icon who left a legacy of articles, papers and books that everyone in the PM profession should read. I also authored my first editorial in a year, unable to resist writing about the current pandemic and multiple crises affecting many countries, especially the United States. After reading about black elephants, I hope some of you will offer feedback. Finally, welcome to new series author Massimo Pirozzi, who has agreed to contributing articles based on his new book showcasing the importance of the stakeholder perspective and relationship management. Thank you to everyone who contributed this month.”
