## 36 new works by 43 authors added to PMWL in August

### ***PM World Collection grows to 3,622 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,584 different authors in more than 70 countries***

9 August 2020 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 36 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 43 different authors representing 20 different countries were published in the August 2020 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://pmworldjournal.com/>. The new additions bring the total in the PM World Collection to 3,622 original works by 1,584 different authors in 70+ countries. According to PMWJ Editor David Pells, “We’ve received an increasing number of featured papers in recent months. These are generally well-researched and fully-referenced papers by academic researchers, executives and professional leaders. Eleven are included this month, some on important new or important topics in program and project management.”

New authors this month include Danilo Arba (Italy/Peru), Alassane Bandé (Canada/Burkina Faso), Abdirahim Hasan (Somaliland), Prof Lavignon Ika (Canada), Arvi Kuura (Estonia), Peter Mackie (UK), Lorena Mathien (USA), Amira Metwally (Egypt), Amitha Mosapeta (USA), Prof Jan Saint-Macary (Canada), and Fernando Santiago (Canada). New works from 32 authors already included in the library were also added.

“We’ve also added a couple new series topics recently, including those by Prof John Cable, Iain Fraser, Massimo Pirozzi and Fernando Santiago, who is new this month,” Pells adds. “The series articles are all on important topics by recognized experts. The advisory articles are all potentially useful, the commentaries highly interesting, and the reports are both interesting and entertaining. The Second Editions are very interesting this month, and readers should never miss reading Spring’s interviews; this month it’s with Robert Buttrick in the UK.”
