33 new works added to PMWL in January

PM World Collection grows to 3,835 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,612 different authors in more than 70 countries

10 January 2021– Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 33 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 32 different authors representing 17 different countries were published in the January 2021 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://peworldjournal.com/>. They can now be found among the most recent papers, articles and book reviews on the PMWL home page at <https://peworldlibrary.net/>.

The new additions bring the total in the PM World Collection to 3,835 original works by 1,612 different authors in 70+ countries. The collection is growing each month by 30+ new works from many different authors; of the 32 authors this month, 7 were new to the journal and library. According to PMWJ Editor David Pells, “This 101st edition was pretty full, with contributions in many categories, including an interview, ten featured papers, six series articles, six reports, three commentaries and two second editions. This is also a very international edition, with 17 countries represent among the authors, more than normal. We’re trying to become the most global online PM publication and I think we’re getting close.”

New authors this month include Muhammad Artono (Indonesia), Prof Jeremy Bellah (USA), Bezwada Ravi Kumar (India), Tony Noorwicaksono (Indonesia), Femto Nur Pratama (Indonesia), Pooja Rawat (India) and Veikko Vällilä (Finland). New works from 25 authors already included in the library were also added.

“I’m afraid that I’ve really done it this month with another controversial editorial,” Pells adds. “Titled ‘Project Management Needs a Higher Purpose’, it’s a follow on to my Black Elephants editorial last June. 2020 was a tumultuous and traumatic year, with the pandemic, fires, hurricanes, social unrest and other crises. This editorial was my response; please read it and send me your reaction.”
