## 27 new works added to PM World Library

### **PM World Collection grows to 4008 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,652 authors in more than 70 countries**

10 July 2021– Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 27 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 33 different authors representing 17 different countries were published in the July 2021 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://peworldjournal.com/>. The new additions bring the total in the PM World Collection to 4,008 original works by 1,652 different authors located around the world. The collection is growing each month by an average of 25-35 new works from many different authors; of the 33 authors this month, 14 were new to the journal and library. New works from 18 authors already included in the library were also added.

“We were very happy to publish more works by PMWJ correspondents this month, including three interviews and seven reports,” Pells adds. “Our correspondents are very experienced and knowledgeable about project management; their contributions are always interesting and useful. The series, advisory and commentary articles are also great this month. I hope all readers will give them a go.”
