## **27 new works added to PM World Library**

***PM World Collection grows to 4114 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,686 authors in more than 50 countries***

13 November 2021 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 27 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 27 different authors representing 15 different countries were published in the November 2021 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://pmworldjournal.com/>. The new additions bring the total in the PM World Collection to 4,114 original works by 1,686 different authors located around the world. New works from 20 authors already included in the library were also added.

“Darren Dalcher is back with another thought-provoking article this month,” Pells adds, “along with Robert Buttrick and Frank Saladis in the series category. The three advisories are on really varied topics, as are the five interesting commentary articles. And once again we include six informative reports about projects, project management and innovative work in six different countries. There should be something here for everyone.”
