### Why from Le Havre?

The French city of Le Havre is situated in Normandy: in 1728, the first coffee beans were brought from the colonies. At that time, Le Havre was the biggest port of importation of coffee in Europe. There was also a coffee 'stock exchange' in Le Havre.

## Why is it called Jacques Vabre?

The brand Jacques Vabre wanted to recreate the coffee road, used by the boats of 17<sup>th</sup> century.

#### Some cornerstone events

#### "CAP POUR ELLE"

In 2021, the Transat Jacques Vabre launched a project for women in the shape of the "Cap pour Elle" programme, a joint operation with Saint-James. Its aim is to support a crew entering a transatlantic race for the first time with financial (€40,000 grant) and sporting assistance (mentoring and coaching). Julia and Jeanne COURTOIS, a set of 29-year-old twins from Brest, won the contest in May. Jeanne works as an engineer in the defence industry and Julia is a pharmacist. Both have accumulated experience in sailing (including the Tour de France à la voile) and in other sports, with a combined total of 5 Ironman triathlons, 3 ultra-trail races and more. They support Fifty-Fifty, a charity that uses sailing to give female victims of violence a clean start and fights to move the sport towards gender parity. It is a cause close to their heart and, as one of

As a joint project with French Tech Le Havre Normandy and French Tech Martinique, the Transat Jacques Vabre is organising a double contest this year in which students and start-ups will vie to develop cutting-edge solutions to promote renewable power, the circular economy and the conservation of biodiversity. The Transat Jacques Vabre Normandie Le Havre is stepping up to the new challenge of becoming a commitment platform for a sustainable transformation.

## Grand Paris Express – the most important urban program in Europe<sup>3</sup>

What is it? the Grand Paris Express is the creation of 4 new metro lines that will connect the different suburbs around Paris (without having to go through Paris). This gigantic project will transform Paris and its suburb and must be ready for 2024.

Today, to go from a suburb of Paris to another suburb of Paris by train, you need to go through Paris.

## Some numbers

- 68 stations and each station will have a different design
- More than 480 ha public space reused
- 150 projects

The trains will be automatic. 80% of the new stations will be connected to the actual network.

### A huge transformation and impact in people's life


The Grand Paris Express is more than an architectural project.

- **Social**, i twill bring transportation in cities where there were not.
- **Urban**: around the new stations, there will be new houses, offices, shops, services, green areas and public spaces.
- **Environnemental**: the aim is to reduce the transport time and then propose a real alternative to car, reducing the traffic jams and the pollution.
- **Economic : 115 000 new jobs** must be created when it will operate. It will also contribute to attract more offers or services.
