25 new works added to PM World Library

PM World Collection grows to 4190 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,707 authors in more than 50 countries

15 February 2022 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 25 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 24 different authors representing 14 different countries were published in the February 2022 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://pmworldjournal.com/>. The new additions bring the total in the PM World Collection to 4,190 original works by 1,707 different authors located around the world. The collection is growing each month by an average of 25-30+ new works from many different authors; of the 24 authors this month, 7 were new to the journal and library. According to PMWJ Managing Editor David Pells, “This was another strong edition with two excellent interviews, five featured papers, five good series articles, six interesting advisory and commentary articles and five great reports. The papers on corruption risks in construction by Bob Prieto and project management maturity models by Henny Portman are major new works on these important topics.”

New authors this month include Danie du Plooy (South Africa), Prof Irene Chinwe Efakalem (Nigeria), Prof. N.B. Iheama (Nigeria), Prof Les Labuschagne (South Africa), Dr. Graham Anesu Mhlakaza (Zimbabwe), Christopher Omajuwa (Nigeria) and Louise Worsley (South Africa). New works from 17 authors already included in the library were also added.

“We are excited to launch a new series this month,” Pells adds. “Titled ‘Project Management in Southern Africa: Approaches, Experiences, Trends’, the series will be authored by leaders from PM South Africa. The series stems from the cooperation agreement struck between the PMWJ and PMSA last year and is intended to support the PM profession in South Africa, attract more authors and readers there, and help bring PM experience and knowledge from southern Africa to the rest of the world. The first article by Les Labuschagne sets the stage; can’t wait to see the next article.”
