Gaining this accreditation confirms that the PDO Project Management competence development system is on a par with other major international capital-intensive organisations.

The ChPP standard is a professional benchmark that demonstrates attainment of a defined level of technical knowledge, professional practice and ethical behaviour in projects. It forms the basis of the assessment that applicants must pass to become chartered and be included on the Register of Chartered Project Professionals.
