30 new works added to PM World Library

PM World Collection grows to 4429 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,780 authors in more than 50 countries

15 October 2022 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 30 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 34 different authors representing 14 different countries were published in the October 2022 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://pmworldjournal.com/>. The new additions bring the total in the PM World Collection to 4,429 original works by 1,780 different authors located around the world. The collection is growing each month by an average of 30-35+ new works from many different authors; of the 34 authors this month, 10 were new to the journal and library. According to PMWJ Managing Editor David Pells, “This was another interesting and diverse edition with two letters to the editor, two interviews, five featured papers, six good series articles, three interesting advisory and commentary articles, and four great reports. Four conference papers are included this month in the Second Editions category, along with four book reviews. Hopefully these works will be useful to many readers around the world.”

New authors this month include William R. Doernbach (USA), Dr. Monica Gallant (UAE), Dr. Andrew Grandage (USA), Dr. Rangika Halwatura (Sri Lanka), Tatiana E. Sayah Kharma (Lebanon), K. A. Buddhika Kodithuwakku (Sri Lanka and Denmark), Edward Leydon (USA), Dr. Pranab Pani (UAE) and Phuong Tran (USA). New works from 24 authors already included in the library were also added.

“The conference papers in the second editions category really add depth and range to the contents each month,” Pells adds. “By teaming with universities and professional groups, and acting as their media partner, we can republish well researched and well written papers on highly relevant topics each month. Authors of such papers can often double their exposure that way, as well as share research with a much wider audience.”
