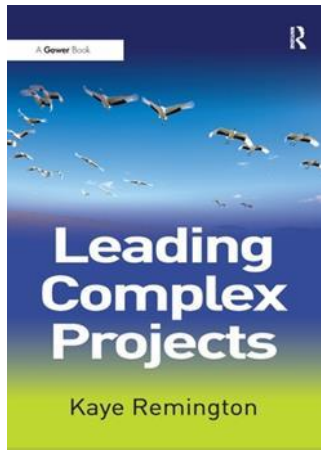

Introduction

The book titled **Leading Complex Projects** discusses how to apply project management in big projects from different industry sectors in everyday life. The book engages the reader in the analysis of different features required during the whole delivery process of the project management. The book dives deep into leadership as a process, so that conflict can be analyzed, addressed, and resolved. The book explains relevant aspects to consider during the project's life cycle, such as complexity, communication, teams, portfolio-program, challenges, culture, political skill, crises, governance, key roles, peace, resilience, and courage.

Overview of Book's Structure

- **Chapter 1.** In this chapter is analyzed the notion of comprehending complexity by contrasting four key points: importance of early recognition of complexity by all stakeholders, the difference between complex and complicated projects, indicators of project complexity, project specific factors contributing to project complexity. Complex projects are characterized by uncertainty, ambiguity and decreasing levels of trust. Despite these factors, many complex projects are successfully executed through the application of the various subjects of project management knowledge.
- **Chapter 2.** This chapter dives into complex communication networks, social networks, informal networks, communication styles, communications planning,

communications risks. Communication is a very common word used in project management vocabulary and even can cause the project failure.

- **Chapter 3.** This chapter explains the relevance managing project teams through the comparison with a symphony orchestra. It's necessary to get the right balance between the players and the instruments. The chapter also analyzes the personalities, behavioural styles, strengths, and weaknesses.
- **Chapter 4.** This chapter exposes portfolio and program thinking as an effective way to work with complexity, considering the variety, perspective, and flexibility needed.
- **Chapter 5.** This chapter gives detailed information about innovative thinking as an important key to managing complexity.
- **Chapter 6.** This chapter discusses the thinking process, in order to make complex decisions considering the uncertainty. It exposes the concept of the linear rationality.
- **Chapter 7.** This chapter explains how cultural differences and misunderstandings between teams contribute to project complexity. It's necessary to consider the cultural boundaries, organizational cultures, project cultures, international projects, and generational culture.
- **Chapter 8.** This chapter is related to political influence, project leadership and successful leadership. Building political influence skills at all levels and dealing with negative political activity.
- **Chapter 9.** Focuses on crises. It exposes detailed information about systemic perspectives and crisis management.
- **Chapter 10.** Introduces the reader to the Governance field. Gives enough information about governance structures, governance in complex environments, and implementing governance.
- **Chapter 11.** Takes the reader through the concept of authority. The key points in this chapter are leadership roles and layers, linking roles to level and type of complexity, assigning key roles, authority to select and replace key personnel and accountability and assessment.
- **Chapter 12.** Discusses the partners for peace. The key points in this chapter are the case for partnering, mindsets that get in the way of partnering, procurement strategies for partnering and developing a partnering relationship.
- **Chapter 13.** Analyzes the humility concept. The key points in this chapter are a right estimate of oneself iconoclasm – the capability to break down barriers, psychologist's point of view and traits not associated with effective leadership.

- **Chapter 14.** Summarizes the impression the leader made. The key points in this chapter are charisma, communication, resilience, determination, and courage.
