33 new works added to PM World Library in June

PM World Collection grows to 4689 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,846 authors in 90+ countries

15 June 2023 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 33 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 42 different authors representing 14 different countries were published in the June 2023 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <u>https://pmworldjournal.com/</u>.
