35 new works added to PM World Library in July

PM World Collection grows to 4722 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,859 authors in 90+ countries

14 July 2023 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 35 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 41 different authors in 16 different countries were published in the July 2023 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://peworldjournal.com/>. The new additions bring the total in the **PM World Collection** to 4,722 original works by 1,859 different authors located around the world. The collection is growing each month by 30-40 new works from many different authors; of the 41 authors this month, 14 were new to the journal and library. New works from 27 authors already included in the library were also added.

“I am also happy to republish papers this month from the recent University of Maryland PM Symposium in April and the 15th UT Dallas PM Symposium in May,” Pells adds. “The PMWJ is a media partner for both conferences, both of which have research papers prepared by presenters. After the events, I select papers for publication in the PMWJ that I think will resonate with our readers. So please check out the second editions category; I hope you all agree this month. We will publish more over the next five months.”
