New Complex Project Leadership Competency Standards Announced in Australia

1 November 2023 – Canberra, Australia – The International Centre for Complex Project Management (ICCPM) has announced that new <u>Complex Project Leadership</u> <u>Competency Standards</u> have been endorsed by the Deputy Secretary Capability Acquisition and Sustainment Group, Australian Department of Defence, on behalf of the Commonwealth of Australia.

"The adoption of these competency standards, and the development of a highly skilled workforce with the skills they define, is particularly important as we seek to reform the capability acquisition process to achieve more timely and relevant capability outcomes as directed by Government following the Defence Strategic Review." These competency standards are the result of an international consultation process that brought together leading academics and experienced practitioners over a number of years. With the acknowledgement that primacy is shifting from 'management' to 'leadership' in complex projects, these Standards detail specific competencies required to navigate project complexity.
