29 new works added to PM World Library

PM World Collection grows to 4,856 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,908 authors in 90+ countries

15 November 2023 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 29 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 42 different authors in 15 different countries were published in the November 2023 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://peworldjournal.com/>. The new additions bring the total in the **PM World Collection** to 4,856 original works by 1,908 different authors located around the world.
