This edition has seen huge participation and involvement of people, especially in workshops aimed to deep dive into the practical exercise of Project Management. Maturing status of public sector PM services and ongoing challenges

One of the first speeches was about the urgent need to strengthen the administrative status in terms of Project Management discipline. The adoption of project management is the key element for a necessary paradigm change in the world of public construction, that allows better responses to the needs of the community. "Public should work with limited time and costs": although this assumption is increasingly true, the introduction of PM in public works still struggles to catch on. The intervention presented an analysis of:

- the evolution of the regulatory framework with the new procurement code;
- public demand for PM services in the last year.

The speech concluded with the presentation of the virtuous model adopted by Jubilee 2025 and an analysis of the challenges faced in the last year and the main challenges for next year.

Project Management meets intellectual property

In another stream of the PMexpo, Leonardo Maria Seri⁷ discussed to what extent the protection of an intangible assets in the management of a project, for the company and the life of a business, can have an important role to achieve a competitive advantage in the market and to protect investments, which could give lead to innovations and build the recognizability of a product or a brand. Whether it is managing the development and launch of new products or new brands, in the context of a collaboration between companies to innovate or to enter new markets we need to make clear what can be protected and with what tools: we must analyze, design and plan the protection of intellectual property assets in project management, defining their objectives and timing, identifying the most appropriate tools to achieve the objectives set, also taking into account costs and protection strategies. Proper planning and management of Intellectual Property assets protection strategies allow organizations to lay a solid foundation for protection against usurpers and counterfeiters and is useful to further enhance your assets.

The project management system in the "Bambino Gesù" Children's Hospital

In recent years, the Hospital had achieved economic and financial results that were not in line with expectations. To guarantee its patients the level of clinical-care excellence it had drawn on its own resources, putting at risk the sustainability in the long term. From here, Health organizations felt the need for a substantial change; the managerial challenge has become to achieve full economic and financial balance, nonetheless ensuring the maintenance of quality standards in terms of clinical care, scientific research and reception. The speech summarised the experience gained in introducing a project management system within the organization, the obstacles, the solutions adopted and the results achieved.

"It's raining manager": the evolution of the competences of the Sustainability Project Manager

The following speech was about the revolution of the "pluvial" era of the PNRR⁹, in which, with the availability of hundreds of billions to use and transform into valuable projects to carry out the ecological transition, new sustainable managerial skills are becoming increasingly valuable. We need a strong capacity for implementation, a strong vocation for innovation, with greater awareness of economic sustainability, impact on work and the environment. For this reason, we must think in a hybrid way, with "T-Shaped" skills: horizontal to manage risks, change, new technologies, but above all vertical to use the financial resources available and transform projects into value. The Sustainability Project Manager must develop the ability to "make things happen", to magically bring new financial opportunities; he must know the relevant trends and their implications, be credible and operate with a systemic vision that connects all environmental, social and economic aspects, managing complex processes and relationships.

What can we do if a project doesn't go as planned or as expected?

After a generous lunch break, sessions restarted with a topical speech performed by two of the most influent Italian personalities in the context of Project Management, Massimo Pirozzi and Marco Caressa. Managing a project means continuously elaborating and taking decisions, so the processes and tools to support "decision making" are of primary importance. Generalizing is always difficult, however it is possible to identify "commonality" among the projects in terms of outcomes, their possible causes and their monitoring and control processes. The speech highlighted some typical deviations that can occur in projects, with the related "good practices" to manage them. In particular, it showed a "data driven" framework to support the characteristic decisions of project management and some innovative ideas on how artificial intelligence (AI) could enhance its use, through application examples of ChatGPT-4.

Sustainable Project Management: A multidimensional value-based approach

After lunch, in another room took place a special speech of ISIPM Young¹⁵ Team, exploring the work¹⁶ issued last summer in the PM World Journal based on the concept of sustainability. A sustainable project focuses on creating and implementing strategies that take balanced account of economic, social and environmental dimensions. The economic dimension concerns costs, investments and budgetary sustainability, while the social dimension refers to the relational aspects of an organization with the social context, as well as the environmental dimension aims to respect and protect the ecosystem. Since sustainable projects target different types of value, we propose an innovative project management approach based on value, and that manages effectively, through key performance indicators (KPIs) the creation of value for stakeholders in terms of economic sustainability, social equity and environmental protection.



Workshop Sessions

The main ability that the PM must be able to master, when approaching a new group, is to recognize her or his coworkers, in order to calibrate the communication, inspire confidence and motivate to the achievement of the objectives set, trying to generate the greatest possible sense of engagement around them. The conductor will stimulate numerous reflections on the issues of leadership, team management, recognition, the enhancement of talent and the efficiency of team work through small games and experiential proposals. The aim is to arrive at common group conclusions, following the reflection on the activities just carried out, enhancing the points of view and the experience of each individual for an ever-new common awareness.

Marshmallow Challenge

The marshmallow challenge is a simply designed exercise and team building activity for small groups, very interesting to transpose into the logic of Agile Project Management.

Groups must build the highest self-supporting structure in 18 minutes with spaghetti, duct tape and twine and place a whole marshmallow on top. The challenge helps participants improve their innovative and problem-solving skills, helping them discover the value of prototyping. Self-evaluation guided experience with the ISIPM-Prado model®

The aim of the workshop is the compilation of a self-assessment, led by Assessor ISIPM-Prado²⁵, through a questionnaire of 60 questions on the website www.maturita.isipm.org, in order to quantify a synthetic value of general maturity of your organization, distributed over 7 dimensions of analysis:

- project management skills;
- technical and contextual skills:
- behavioural skills;
- methodology;
- information system;
- strategic alignment;
- organisational structure.

Analysis of non-verbal language

Does non-verbal communication play an important role in human communication? Each of us is naturally led to the interpretation of the emotional information of whom we are facing. Emotional states are the basis of intentions, motivations, personality and consequently human behavior. During the masterclass, the speakers addressed the strategies to make more effective one of the soft skills most required by recruiters: effective communication. Through the presentation of the SPIC experimental protocol, consisting of role plays created and revisited by Dr. Maria Rosaria Spinelli and Dr. Domenico Piccininno, interested parties participated in a practical workshop analyzing the main scientific techniques of Communication and non-verbal language useful at a social and professional level. The skills acquired will be fundamental in interrelationships by characterizing and improving the professional and personal domain by scientifically using non-verbal indicators as data to expand the information base. At the end of the masterclass the speakers presented the results of research and surveys conducted on some samples of participants as well as the course of specialization about analysis of non-verbal language and techniques of recognition of lies and manipulation.

Innovation Projects: Design Thinking meets Sustainability

Antonella Chirichiello and Claudia Spagnuolo took part in the PMexpo 2023 with an experiential/practical workshop, aimed to share with the participants the news related to innovation & sustainability projects; they also discussed how these types of projects apply "Design Thinking" to achieve their goals. Sustainable development is a major challenge and it is no longer possible to innovate without taking into account the potential impacts on society and the environment: all new projects (not only innovation projects) must take into account the needs of people during the design phase of the project output and in the definition of adequate sustainability of the portfolio and its projects (project sustainability). With this practical Workshop, the speakers showed how to restore in our projects the relationships between people, materials and local realities through the Design Thinking as suggested by John Thackara (international expert of sustainable design, author of "In the Bubble: Designing in a Complex World") and the recent research of the Polytechnic Institute of Milan.
