38 new works added to PM World Library

PM World Collection grows to 4,949 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,940 authors in 90+ countries

The tribute includes memories and statements from Davidson's family and friends around the world."

New works by 29 authors already included in the library were also added.

"In addition to the tribute, this edition contains a number of outstanding and significant works," Pells adds. "The interview with Connie Beck, President of AIPM in Australia continues our showcase of professional leaders around the world. Eight featured papers and seven series articles provide significant depth this month. The articles, reports, second editions and book reviews that follow make this one of the most robust editions in recent months. Please read some of these works; hopefully they will make you think or do something differently on your future projects."
