33 new works added to PM World Library

PM World Collection grows to 4,982 project management articles, papers & other works by 1,947 authors in 90+ countries

15 March 2024 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 33 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 38 authors in 19 different countries were published in the March 2024 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <u>https://pmworldjournal.com/</u>. The new additions bring the total in the **PM World Collection** to 4,982 original works by 1,947 different authors located around the world. This is a point of pride, that we are publishing quality works that other authors want to be associated with. Hopefully we can continue to produce interesting new works that contribute to the global body of knowledge in project management."

"Of course, our readers are important too," Pells adds. "and we're happy our readership is growing. But since our mission is to support knowledge sharing, my primary activity is attracting, editing and publishing quality works. PM professionals gain experience and knowledge throughout their careers. Authoring a good article or paper can enhance that knowledge; sharing through publication can also bring other benefits including enhanced CVs, recognition and even PDUs or CEUs for recertification purposes."
