Stanislaw was a significant contributor to PMI's PMBOK® Guide, the PMI Standard for Program Management and other PMI standards. He has lectured at global PMI and IPMA congresses and other international conferences. Dr. Gasik has also authored many articles and papers for the PMWJ, including a series of articles in 2023/24 titled "Let's Talk About Public Projects", which can be found in the PM World Library here.
