Submit an Abstract



- An abstract is a concise summary of the key points of your paper. It is typically about 250 words and succinctly describes three critical presentation areas: 1) problem/issue to be addressed, 2) methodology/process used to address the problem/issue, and 3) conclusions/findings
- A good abstract
 - Accurately represents the contents of the paper
 - Is coherent and readable
 - Highlights key content
 - Is concise and to the point

How to submit an abstract

- Complete the application form:
 - Speaker contact information
 - Speaker photo and about 150 word biography
 - Presentation title and abstract
 - Talent triangle classification
 - Applicable certifications
 - Learning objectives*
 - Abstract
- Any co-presenter information must be submitted with the original application. (Maximum of 3 presenters)

Other important information

- Incomplete submissions will be returned. These may be resubmitted once all requirements have been included
- Papers must not have been previously published
- This is not a sales pitch! This is an educational event. If selected, you are presenting as an industry expert. This is not a marketing event for your business
- Speakers' expenses are not reimbursed; however, unlike other conferences, speakers attend the entire symposium for free!

Frequently Asked Questions



How do I submit an abstract?

All abstracts must be submitted via the online submission form.

Do I have to register for the symposium if my abstract is accepted?

No, if your abstract is selected you will be automatically registered for the symposium at no charge.

Are travel expenses reimbursed?

No, since speakers attend the symposium at no cost, we do not reimburse for travel expenses.

When do you need my submission?

Abstracts are due by Friday, January 16, 2026. Incomplete submissions will not be considered.

When will I find out if my submission is accepted?

Selections will be announced by Friday, February 20, 2026.

How will my abstract be evaluated?

Abstract submissions are double-blind peer reviewed. Evaluations are primarily based on:

- New / Preferred Topics of greatest interest (see page 2)
- Newness of approach to topic
- Anticipated Audience Appeal
- Quality of Writing
- Clearly stated and well-conceived objectives
- Well-articulated perspectives
- Clearly described methods used and results obtained
- Appropriate and well-executed research methods

What are Learning Objectives?

Learning objectives are clear and concise statements that describe the intended outcomes of instruction. They should represent the skills that learners can expect to demonstrate after completing instruction.

Statements must be specific, observable, and measurable.

Frequently Asked Questions



Can I use AI in creating the abstract, presentation, or paper?

You must cite any use of Generative AI in preparing the abstract, presentation, or paper, following the guidelines established by the UT Dallas Jindal School of Management.

“Typically, all content that you pulled from another source must be cited.

This includes for papers, presentations, reports, and scholarly writing. For generative AI, you would cite:

- Generated text or data that you rewrote, revised, or rephrased
- Generated text that you copy/pasted. Use quotation marks.
- Quoted generated text that you discuss in a paper, report, or presentation
- AI tools used to process or analyze data
- Creative works like images, data visualizations, videos, or music”

How many PDUs can be earned?

Paper presenters can earn up to 17 PDUs for authoring and presenting a paper at the symposium and up to another 9 PDUs for attending the full symposium.

How can I ensure a successful presentation?

Attend PMI Toastmaster meetings and practice your presentation skills. There will also be a webinar in the spring that will give hints to help your presentation skills.
