## 33 new works added to PM World Library

**PM World Collection grows to 5,556 project management articles, papers & other works by 2,215 authors in 90 countries**

15 January 2026 – Dallas, London, Sydney – PM World has announced that 33 new articles, papers and other original works about program and project management have been added to the PM World Library (PMWL) this month. These contributions by 48 difference authors in 16 different countries were published in the January 2026 edition of the *PM World Journal* (PMWJ) at <https://pmworldjournal.com/>. The new additions bring the total in the [PM World Collection](#) to 5,556 original works by 2,215 different authors located around the world. The collection is growing each month by 30-40 new works from many different authors; of the 48 authors this month 18 were new to the journal and library. According to PMWJ Managing Editor David Pells, “I am happy that our new peer review program is attracting submittals, 28 papers from authors in 18 different countries since June. Many of these submittals are research papers related to local industry and professional topics, which means they should be of immediate interest to practitioners in those countries. I want to emphasize that even with the introduction of peer reviewed paper, the PMWJ remains focused on practitioners. I hope that is apparent to our readers.”

New works by 29 former authors were also included this month.

“While there is always something new in each edition of the journal,” Pells adds, “it is really returning authors who keep each edition full and useful. Multiple featured papers represent serious research work by those authors; series article by globally-recognized project management leaders help maintain our momentum, while advisory articles, case studies and reports should attract a lot of attention. Adding a student paper, a cute story and book reviews should add enough variety to satisfy most of you. I hope it is working.”
